Grounds Report 2018

Two work days were held in 2018. The first was our usual clean-up day in May. The second was in Oct. when we closed up for the season.

There were no acts of vandalism at the facility in 2018.

Garbage sorting continues to be an issue at events and during rentals. Some groups are now taking their garbage with them when they leave.

Work done:

- TIR graded the road as far as the culvert, but not until late in the season after the Councillor for the area was contacted. Wil-Kare graded the rest of the road.
- During clean-up day, general cleaning was done. Rails and planks were replaced on fences of 2 rings. The warm-up ring needed a lot of work to repair.
- Also in May the bottom boards on most of the stalls that back onto the lean-to stalls were put in and various other holes were patched. A couple of barn posts were strengthened.
- One roof panel in barn #2 was replaced after it blew off during the winter.
- Sand was delivered but only some of it has made it into the main ring.
- The manure was moved out of the storage area up to a clearing in the woods.
- A new sign was purchased to help keep people out of the grounds.
- Pattons winterized the plumbing in Nov.
- Minor repairs around the facility are on-going.

Series and Hunter Horse Shows Committee Report 2018

CNHP offered three Series Shows in 2018. They continued to bring in revenue for the club. Entry numbers were consistent with 2017. We went with one Combined Hunter class, instead of two, with the heights being 2' and 2'6". The Hunter Stake remained at 2' or 2'6". We added a Hunter Pattern Poles class, a Cross Rail class and an 18" off class. They were all well received. We also added a class for green horses and ponies, which had very few entries. The number of Stakes classes remains at 4. The number of divisions numbered 10. Thanks to the hard work of our Board members, all Stakes classes were sponsored, along with the divisions. The Stakes classes were sponsored for \$100.00, the payout being to 6th place. All fees remained the same. Division winners were awarded summer sheets. Reserve place winners were awarded gift certificates from the local tack shops. The club wants to thank those who sponsored divisions in 2018. It is greatly appreciated.

CNHP offered a Hunter Show in May, the day following our first Series Show. The format and classes remained the same. Prize monies were handed out for division winners.

All hunter courses were designed by two CNHP members, who had taken the Course Design Clinic offered by the NSEF.

Central Nova Horse Trials 2018 Year End Report

2018 marked the eighteenth year of Central Nova Horse Trials. This EC Silver & Bronze competition ran on Sunday, July 15th. 47 riders from around the Maritimes came to compete and it was a very successful day with everyone enjoying themselves. The dressage judges were Susan Fraser and Roz Moskovits, both from NS. They were also the Ground Jury members.

CNHP received a generous grant from HTNS this year and were able to build a Pre-Entry course. 19 senior & junior riders entered this new division, which was great. Ongoing maintenance is required on the course with a few jumps being replaced prior to the competition as they had come to the end of their lifespan. This type of replacement will have to continue in 2019.

We had a very enthusiastic Eventing Committee comprised of myself, Sheri Morehouse, Margie Johnson, Carollyn Crewe, Jackie Waugh and Lisa Pettigrew. George Macintosh and Stacey and Norman Paupin also worked hard alongside us to help get ready for the competition and Tami White continued as Chief Scorer for the day. Sheila McLellan ran the canteen for the day, which was much appreciated. Once again, Darlene Stevenson and Sid Peters were a great help with the show preparations throughout the spring & summer – thanks so much.

Both course preparations, getting sponsorship and running the competition requires much time and commitment and the members were outstanding in their devotion. We'd like to thank all those people that came out to work on the course and who volunteered during the competition. We also have a number of volunteers who return each year to help work at the competition which is wonderful. Your help was much appreciated.
