Grounds Report 2019

Two work days were held in 2019. The first was our usual clean-up day in May. The second was in Oct. when we closed up for the season.

There were no acts of vandalism at the facility in 2019.

Garbage sorting continues to be an issue at events and during rentals. Some groups are now taking their garbage with them when they leave.

Work done:

- TIR graded the road as far as the culvert, after the Councillor for the area was contacted. Wil-Kare graded the rest of the road.
- During clean-up day, general cleaning was done. The washrooms were painted. Several holes in the clubhouse were repaired. Parts of the bleachers were painted. A few boards were replaced on the manure storage bin. Mitch Cameron brought up his mini-hoe & repaired the swales around the property.
- Toilets were repaired, the door lock system was repaired so the door will lock and a handle was installed on the door.
- A barn sill and a hole in the barn were both repaired.
- Manure in the storage area up in the woods was pushed back twice by Wolfe's Grounds Maintenance.
- The manure was moved out of the storage bin up to a clearing in the woods twice by Jason Matthews.
- Pattons winterized the plumbing in Nov.
- Minor repairs around the facility are on-going.

2019 marked the nineteenth year of Central Nova Horse Trials. This EC Silver & Bronze competition ran on Sunday, July 14th. 61 riders from around the Maritimes came to compete and it was a very successful (but long!) day with everyone enjoying themselves. We also enjoyed hosting a Canadian Pony Club Regional Rally with the event with members from all three provinces competing.

The dressage judges were Donna McInnis from NB and Roz Moskovits from NS. They were also the Ground Jury members. The Technical Delegate was Linda Plank from ON. HTNS kindly gave us a travel grant to put towards the cost of bringing Linda to NS, which was much appreciated.

Ongoing maintenance is required on the course with a few jumps being replaced prior to the competition as they had come to the end of their lifespan. This type of replacement will have to continue in 2020. CNHP received another generous grant from HTNS this year for course building and were able to enhance the Pre-Entry course and add new jumps to the other levels.

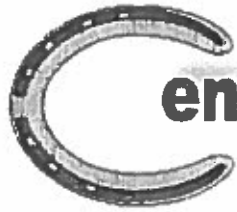

Series and Hunter Horse Shows Committee Report 2019

CNHP offered three Series Shows in 2019. They continued to bring in revenue for the club. Entry numbers increased in 2019. Changes to the class list included changing the Hunter Stakes class to a Handy Hunter Stakes class. The club added four Jumper classes, a Welcome & Speed class at 0.7M and a Welcome & Speed class at 0.75M. Entry numbers for these classes were fairly small. We replaced the Keyhole class with the Big T, a combination of barrels & poles. It was well received. The club also eliminated the Pleasure Pattern & Ranch Pleasure classes in the Western division, due to the lack of western rider participants. The new Western Division consisted of Western Horsemanship & Western Pleasure #1 & #2. We dropped the Western Pleasure Stake class. The number of Stakes classes is now at three. The number of divisions increased to 11. Thanks to the hard work of our Board members, all Stakes classes were sponsored, along with the divisions. The Stakes classes were sponsored for \$100.00, the payout being to 6th place. The number refund fee was increased to \$20.00 in hopes of having our back numbers returned. Division winners were awarded Ogilvie saddle pads. Reserve place winners were awarded gift certificates from the local tack shops. The club wants to thank those who sponsored divisions in 2019. It is greatly appreciated.

CNHP offered a Hunter Show in May, the day following our first Series Show. The format and classes remained the same. Prize monies were handed out for division winners.

All hunter courses were designed by CNHP members, who had taken the Course Design Clinic offered by the NSEF.

CNHP also hosted the NSEF Championship show in October, held at the NSPEC in Bible Hill. The show was a lot of extra hard work, but was a success and enjoyed by all.

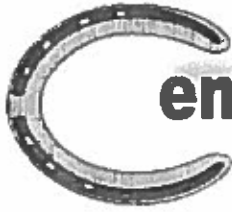
