Rules and Regulations

Central Nova Horse and Pony Association (CNHP) "Spring Spectacular Show" will follow the rules and guidelines outlined through the Nova Scotia Equestrian Federation as it is a sanctioned Competition. Please see www.horsenovascotia.ca for a full outline of rules. It is competitor's responsibility to know if there classes enter qualify for year-end awards.

1. Membership: Current NSEF membership is required to compete and qualify for annual awards. Non-NS residents require proof of out of province PTSO membership to be eligible to compete. CNHP membership is not required to compete, however, CNHP members will receive reduced class and stabling fees and qualify for the CNHP championships awarded at the September show.

2. Age categories: A junior competitor is someone who was 18 years or younger as of January 1, 2022.

3. Person responsible: The person who signs the entry form is the person responsible for the welfare of the horse and the actions of the support team for that entry. It is highly recommended that the "person responsible" also be a member of NSEF (for liability protection). Junior competitors must have their entry form signed by the parent or legal guardian.

4. Conduct: Any act of discourtesy or disobedience by an owner, groom, athlete, coach or family member, to an official, Competition Show Committee member, CNHP volunteers, other spectators or competitors, while at the competition will result in disqualification from the remainder of the competition. The Competition Show Committee has the right to remove anyone from the competition without being liable for compensation or damages.

5. Protective Headgear: All competitors must wear ASTM/SEI*(or FEI)approved protective headgear with the safety harness correctly secured at all times while mounted at the competition or anywhere on the competition grounds. Exception: *Competitors 19 years of age as of January 1, 2022 may compete in the Western Performance Division without an approved safety but must submit a signed Scotia Series Helmet Waiver. Judges will not penalize a Western Performance competitor for wearing an approved helmet.*

6. Ring Numbers: Must be worn at all times when in the competition arena and including the warm-up and schooling areas. If at any time, a horse is being handled (or ridden) by an individual other than the competitor, that person must be in possession of the ring number.

7. Lunging: Lunging will be permitted in a designated ring and time only. Lunging is not permitted in any areas where horses are being ridden.

8. Use of competition equipment: Participants may only use obstacles provided by the Competition Committee in the warm up ring.

9. Stallions: Mannerly stallions may be shown by SENIOR competitors only.

10. Class size: Classes with fewer than 4 entries may be cancelled or combined. Entries will be notified of the changes prior to the start of the show.

11. Entry deadlines and refund: Entries must be received by Saturday May 21, 2022. Entries received after this day will be considered late entries and a \$20 late entry fee will be applied. Post entries the day of the show will not be accepted.

12. Payment: Entries must be paid in full prior to the competition. Cheques and e-transfers are accepted. No postdated cheques. Cheques are payable to Central Nova Horse & Pony Association.

13. NSF Cheque Fees: A \$50 charge will be assessed on all returned cheques.

14. Refunds: 100% of funds refunded with presentation of a veterinarian (or doctor) certificate prior to the start of the show.

15. Stabling: Stabling is limited and will be allotted as entries are received. You must bring your own bedding. Stalls must be completely cleaned out before you leave. Special requests to stable near others will be considered but cannot be guaranteed.

16. Prizes: Ribbons awarded to 6th place. CNHP members can collect points from the May and September shows combined for year-end Champion and Reserve for all divisions.

17. Dogs: We prefer that dogs remain home. If you must bring your dog, the dog must remain leashed at all times. Dogs are not permitted ringside.

18. Children: Young children should not be unattended. For safety reasons, loud play cannot happen near the show rings or warm up areas.

19. Trailer Parking: Trucks and trailers must be parked in designated areas and must not block the flow of other trailers into the grounds. If the trailer area becomes full, cars will be asked to park on the side of the road. Please note that there are no camper hook ups at this location. Fire lanes must remain clear. Vehicles blocking a fire lane may be towed at the owner's expense.

20. Falls: If an athlete falls during a class or in the warm up ring, "Return to Play" guidelines must be followed. A participant with a suspected concussion should not return to participate until assessed medically.

21. Equine Medication Control: NSEF endorses Clean Sport for all equine activities. It is the NSEF's expectation that competitors will ensure their horse's performance is not enhanced with prohibited substances.

22. Covid-19 Protocols: Competitions and Competitors must follow NS Health Act Regulations, including current Covid Guidelines.

23. Equine Welfare: Cruel, abusive or inhumane treatment of a horse by any competitor, owner, coach, trainer or other person, will not be tolerated anywhere on the competition grounds under any circumstances.

24. Soundness: Horses entered in all events must be sound. Final determination of a horse's suitability to continue to show is the judge's decision. Any competitor who in the judge's opinion is riding at risk of injury to their horse or themselves will be asked to withdraw from competition.

25. Safe Sport: All coaches coaching at Scotia Series Competitions must be Safe Sport Complaint based on the NSEF's Safe Sport Standards.

***Please note that it is the responsibility of all coaches and competitors to know the Scotia Series rules, including (but not limited to) rider attire, horse equipment and class expectations. The complete rules can be found on the NSEF website.**

Ring Number: \$20.00 (Refundable when returned)

28. Barns will open at noon on Friday May 27, 2022 and close one hour after the completion of classes on Sunday May 29, 2022.

29. The show office is located in the clubhouse (red building) and will be open Saturday and Sunday mornings at 7 am and close one hour after the last class of each day.

Saturday, May 28, 2022 - Start Time: 8:00 a.m.

Hunter Classes

Hunter horses are judged on their jumping style, movement and soundness. Confirmation is not a consideration. In over fence classes, horses are shown one at a time over a course of 8-10 hunter style obstacles. Two disobediences or fall (of horse or rider) results in elimination from the class. In hunter under saddle classes, competitor will compete in a rail class at walk, trot, and canter both directions of the ring. No more than 10 horses to canter at one time. Cross rail hunters will not be asked to canter.

English Hack

Each division consists of three under saddle classes. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both directions of the ring. In Road Hack rider may be asked to extend the trot and hand gallop.

English Equitation:

To be judged on the rider's seat, hands, management, control of mount and neatness of appearance. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both directions of ring. Possible patterns at the discretion of the judge REMINDER:

- (36)** Junior English Equitation
- (37)** Senior English Equitation

Western

Division consists of three western classes. To be shown at a walk, jog, and lope both directions of the ring.

Exception - **Competitors 19 years old as of January 1st, 2022 competing in the Western Performance Division and Western Horsemanship Class without an approved safety helmet must submit a signed Scotia Series Helmet Waiver to the competition organizer.**

(41) Trail Class

The Trail Class is the performance of a safe, sensible, well-mannered horse over a course of obstacles.

(42) Trail Class Walk Trot/Jog

The Trail Class is the performance of a safe, sensible, well-mannered horse over a course of obstacles.

(43) Ranch Pleasure

To show the working horse's versatility, attitude, and movement. The primary purpose of this class is to show the horse's quality of movement and overall manners and responsiveness while performing the required movements.

Open Walk - Trot/Jog

Division consists of three walk/trot classes open to English and Western riders. To be shown at a walk and trot/jog both directions of the ring.

Note: Participants entering these classes may ONLY enter: Hunter Pattern Poles Walk Trot/jog, Showmanship, Grooming and Conditioning, Walk/ Trot Barrels, and Trial Class Walk Trot/Jog

Open Walk/Trot/Jog

(44) Open Walk Trot/Jog Pleasure

(45) Open Walk Trot/Jog Equitation

(46) Hunter Pattern Poles Walk Trot/Jog

Ride will compete over a course of 4 poles at a trot or jog, as indicated on the posted pattern. Judging is to be 40% athlete and 60% hors performance.

(47) Hunter Pattern Poles

Rider will compete over a course of 4 poles at a trot with canter, as indicated on the posted pattern. Judging is to be 40% athlete and 60% horse performance.

(48) Showmanship Class

A line class, judged on appearance of pony/horse and exhibitor. The ability to show the pony/horse following a prescribed pattern. Will be divided to junior and senior classes if entries warrant.

(49) Lead Line*(Non Sanctioned Class)

To be led at a walk and trot/jog both ways of riding ring. Open to both English and Western attire.

(50) Grooming and Conditioning*(Non Sanctioned Class)

Grooming: Horse spotless, mane neatly banded/braided, nostrils, eyes, and dock clean.

Excess hair on heels removed, tail pulled/plaited or clipped, and end banded square.

Hooves picked out and oiled or hoof blacked inside and out. Handler is smartly attired so that they set off the horse's looks. Tack spotless, buckles polished well and fitting well, all straps in keepers.

Conditioning: A good working condition, well-musclcd and not carrying excess flab. Coat shiny and healthy. Feet well shod or trimmed - no cracks or chips. Horse attentive

Barrels and Poles

Open to both English and Western competitors.

PLEASE NOTE: IT IS MANDAORY FOR ALL RIDERS TO WEAR A HELEMT

Participants are timed to go down to the end of the ring and then back. Best time wins.
